## **<u>A User's Guide to 1 Samuel</u>**, Part 2

**BOOK INTRODUCTION:** As the books of Samuel begin, we are still in the period of the Judges. Eli (a descendant of Aaron's fourth son, Ithamar) is serving as both Israel's judge and HIGH PRIEST at Shiloh, Israel's first capital. Eli's two DEGENERATE sons, Hophni and Phinehas, also served as priests. When all three died on the same day, Samuel assumed the leadership roles of Eli and sons. In fact, Samuel wore every hat a leader of Israel could wear! He was judge, priest, PROPHET, military leader, and the ANOINTER of Israel's first two kings! He was a godly and upright man, and the right man at the right time to transition Israel from judges to kings. The book's central characters are Hannah, Eli, Samuel, Saul, JONATHAN and David. The events of 1 Samuel span a time period of approximately 65 years (1075-1010 BC).
