## A User's Guide to 2 Samuel, Part 2

**BOOK INTRODUCTION:** 2 Samuel opens in the year 1011 BC. David hears the news of Israel's defeat by the Philistines; and, of the deaths of Saul (who HATED David) and Jonathan (who LOVED him). A power struggle ensued between David and Saul's family. David, at age 30, assumed power over Judah, and ruled for SEVEN and ½ years from Hebron. Meanwhile, Saul's commander, Abner, supported ISH-BOSHETH, a son of Saul, who ruled the rest of Israel for TWO years. David was 32 when Abner brought the rest of Israel under his control. Then, at age 37, David captured the Jebusite stronghold of JERUSALEM, and made that his capital (and the rest is history!). The book of 2 Samuel covers David's event-filled 40-year reign, the good, the bad and the ugly (1011-971 BC). And, in case you're wondering why his story matters so much, read the first verse of the New Testament. The first fact we learn about Jesus the Messiah is that He was "the SON of DAVID"!
