MODULE FIVE – A "GIFTED" CHURCH

The inspired letters of Paul are a rich source for knowledge on the Holy Spirit. As we continue our Scripture survey study, we will begin with Paul's letter called 1 Corinthians. Just a casual read-through makes two points abundantly clear: First, this was a very "gifted" church; and, second, it was a very CONFLICTED church! Woven into Paul's corrective teaching are some valuable "Holy Spirit" truths, insights and applications. It is here we learn the answer to this important question: **Did God intend for the miraculous gifts to be temporary, or perpetual**?
