For Starters ...

"SELF-CONTROL" DEFINED:

Self-control is having a HANDLE on yourself, keeping yourself in check, on task and DISCIPLINED.

TWO "SELF-CONTROL" FACTS:

- ❖ Proverbs 16:32 One who is self-controlled is truly STRONG!
- Proverbs 25:28 One who lacks self-control is WEAK and VULNERABLE! (Gen 4:7; Judg 13-16)

The bad news about self-control ...

- 1. Self-control is in short supply in the WORLD ... and sometimes, even in the CHURCH!
 - A. The FEAST: What we do too MUCH of
 - B. The FAST: What we do too LITTLE of
- 2. Self-control, for many, is neither DESIRABE, VALUABLE or NECESSARY! (2 Tim 3:1-4)
 - A. Instead of INTERNAL control, we try to control the EXTERNALS (circumstances, consequences or effects) of our actions!
 - B. The sobering truth about self-control: (Mat 26:41; Rom 7:18-20; James 3:7-8)
 - In and of ourselves, we CANNOT be completely selfcontrolled! (1 Cor 9:25)

The good news about self-control ...

- 3. With the Lord's help, we CAN be self-controlled!
 - A. His indwelling, enabling Holy Spirit PRODUCES self-control in us! (Rom 7:18; 8:5-13; Phil 4:13; 2 Tim 1:7; Gal 5:22-24)
