# A. PROLOGUE: "THE WORD BECAME FLESH" (1:1-18)

(1:1-3) The Eternal Word, Creator in Heaven  $\rightarrow$  (1:4-18) The Eternal Word, Savior on earth

# **B. JESUS' PREPARATION FOR MINISTRY (1:19-3:36)** *Mat 3-4; Mk 1a; Lk 3-4*

(1:19-34) John's ministry and testimony about Jesus  $\rightarrow$  (1:35-51) Jesus' first followers  $\rightarrow$  (2:1-11) Jesus' wedding miracle in Cana  $\rightarrow$  (2:13-22) Jesus cleanses the Temple  $\rightarrow$  (2:23-25) Not all who believed could be trusted  $\rightarrow$  (3:1-21) Nicodemus, a Pharisee, visits Jesus at night  $\rightarrow$  (3:22-36) John's ministry gives way (merges into) to Jesus' ministry

# **D. JESUS' MIDDLE MINISTRY (6:1-10:42)** *Mat 10-17a; Mk 6b-9a; Lk 8-9*

(6:1-15) Miraculous meal!  $\rightarrow$  (6:16-21) Miraculous crossing!  $\rightarrow$  (6:22-59) Jesus' teaching about "the Bread of Life"  $\rightarrow$  (6:60-71) Many disciples leave Jesus  $\rightarrow$  (7:1-52) Jesus attends the Feast of Booths amid questions and controversies  $\rightarrow$  (8:1-11) Jesus extends mercy to an adulteress  $\rightarrow$  (8:12-38) Jesus debates the Jewish leaders, who "can't handle the truth!"  $\rightarrow$  (8:39-59) Speaking of fathers  $\rightarrow$  (9:1-41) Jesus heals a man born blind and teaches about spiritual "blindness!"  $\rightarrow$  (10:1-42) Jesus as the Good Shepherd

(11:1-44) Jesus raises a friend, Lazarus  $\rightarrow$  (11:45-57) The Sanhedrin (Council) plans to kill Jesus  $\rightarrow$  (12:1-8) Jesus anointed by Mary in Bethany  $-\rightarrow$  (12:9-11) The plot to kill Lazarus

#### F. JESUS FULFILLS HIS MINISTRY (12:12-20:31) Mat 21b-28; Mk 11-16; Lk 19-24

#### **EVENING DEVOTION: Time for a Re-call! (John 21)**

At the beginning of His ministry, Jesus "called" twelve men to be His trainees, His disciples. Now, at the end of His earthly life and ministry, He "re-calls" them, especially Simon Peter. As we revisit that scene at the Sea of Galilee, it might be a good time for us to remember and refresh our own "call" to Christ (our initial conversion and commitment).

1. **John 21:1-3** – On two consecutive Sunday evenings, Jesus appeared to His disciples in that upper room. They believed He was alive, and were glad, but they just weren't sure what to do next. One day, Peter and six others retreated to what was ...
